PROGRAM NOTES:

ArtSparks' "Top-Notch Team" (TNT) dancers are exceptional students who were chosen to explore dance and music at a deeper level and perform in their communities. Dancers of TNT were selected from in-school outreach provided by ArtSparks and hail from the Barberton, Cuyahoga Falls, Woodridge, and Akron Public School Districts. These superstars were chosen to be ambassadors of excellence and champions for the arts based on their leadership skills, ability to work as team, and enthusiasm for dance.

Mary- Elizabeth Fenn, Resident Choreographer, a Wisconsin native trained at Milwaukee Ballet School, Central Pennsylvania Youth Ballet, Joffrey Ballet School-NYC, BalletMet, and Point Park University. She has also attended summer programs at Dance New Amsterdam, Juilliard, Hubbard Street Dance Chicago and recently attended Northwest Dance Project's LAUNCH intensive. She was a featured soloist in the DVD live performance of "Unwigged and Unplugged" with Spinal Tap. Mary-Elizabeth has been teaching and choreographing for various studios in Wisconsin for the past five years. She graduated in December 2010 with honors and a BFA in dance from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. She also had the privilege to perform in works by Luc Vanier, Alwin Nikolais, Simone Ferro, Suniti Dernovsek, Janet Lilly, Garth Fagan, and Ed Burgess. Mary-Elizabeth has choreographed the full length Creole Cinderella and the repertoire piece Hello Mother for Neos Dance Theatre.

Penny Saunders, originally from West Palm Beach, Florida, graduated from the Harid Conservatory in 1995, and began her professional career with The American Repertory Ballet under the direction of Septime Webre. She went on to dance with Ballet Arizona, MOMIX Dance Theater, Cedar Lake Ensemble and in 2004 she joined Hubbard Street Dance Chicago. In 2011, Saunders won the International Commissioning Project which launched her choreographic career, creating pieces for Hubbard Streets' main and second company, Whim W'Him, SFDancworks, Neos Dance Theater, Owen Cox Dance Group, and The Nexus Project. Saunders is honored to be the choreographer in residence at The Grand Rapids Ballet receiving support from The New York City Ballet Choreographic Commissions Initiative and to be the recipi-

ent of the 2016 Princess Grace Choreographic Fellowship.

Holly Handman-Lopez received a B.A. from Connecticut College in 1993 and her M.F.A. in Choreography and Performance from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee in 2007. She has worked with many prominent choreographers, including David Dorfman, Nicholas Leichter, and Lisa Race; and she has performed extensively in New York City venues, such as the Dance Theater Workshop, Miller Theater, and the Brooklyn Academy of Music.

Ms. Handman-Lopez's choreography has been shown at a number of colleges and universities – among them Bennington and Bowling Green State University. She has been awarded numerous guest-artist residencies at such prestigious institutions as New York University's Tisch School of the Arts, Sarah Lawrence College, and The New School, where she has taught, choreographed, and directed student performers. She has been a Visiting Artist in the Theater and Dance Department of Oberlin College since 2003. She choreographed Oberlin's production of Orpheus in the Underworld in 2004, A Midsummer Night's Dream in 2007, Kindle in 2007, Tennessee Williams' Vieux Carre in 2008 and in 2009 the Oberlin Dance Company.
